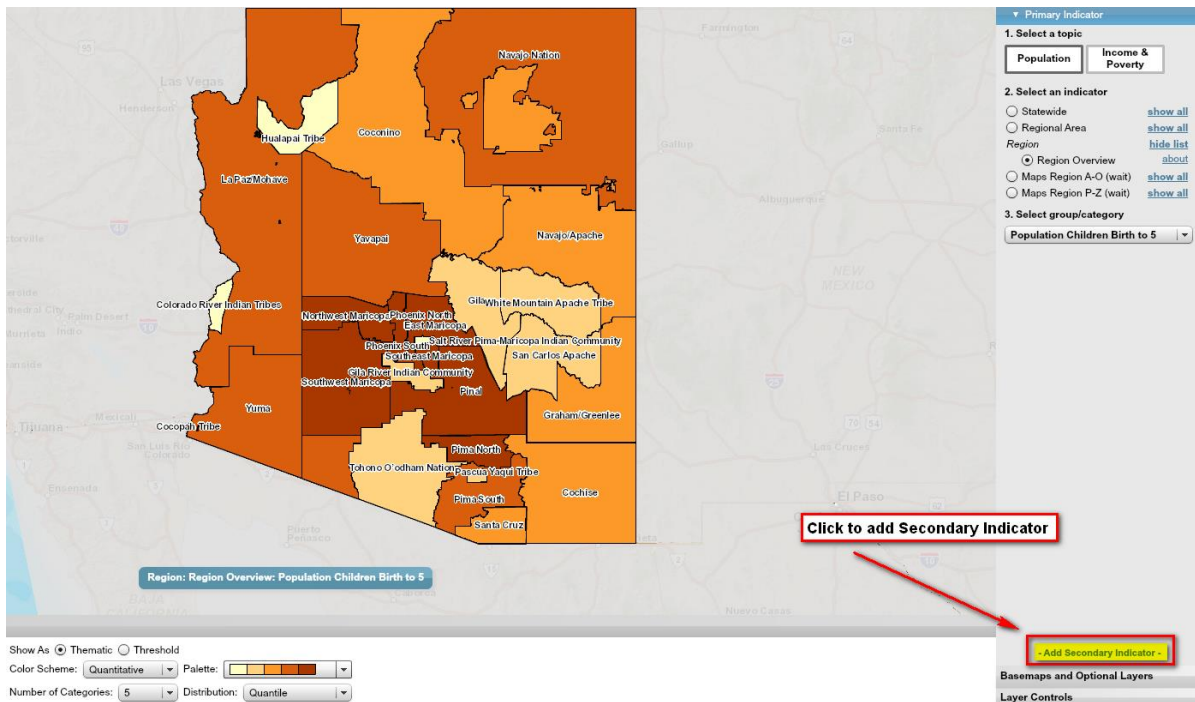


Adding a Secondary Indicator

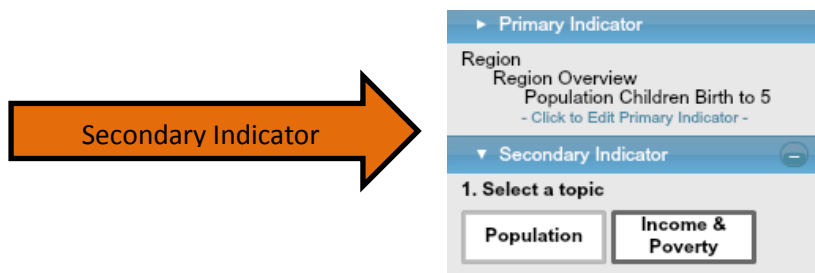
Add a Secondary Indicator

Click **Add a Secondary Indicator** to include additional data for side-by-side or overlap comparison.



Selecting a Secondary Topic

Along the right hand side of the screen, the indicator will split into **Primary Indicator** and **Secondary Indicator** sections. **Select a Topic, Indicator** and **Group/Category** for the secondary indicator following the same selection process for the primary indicator.

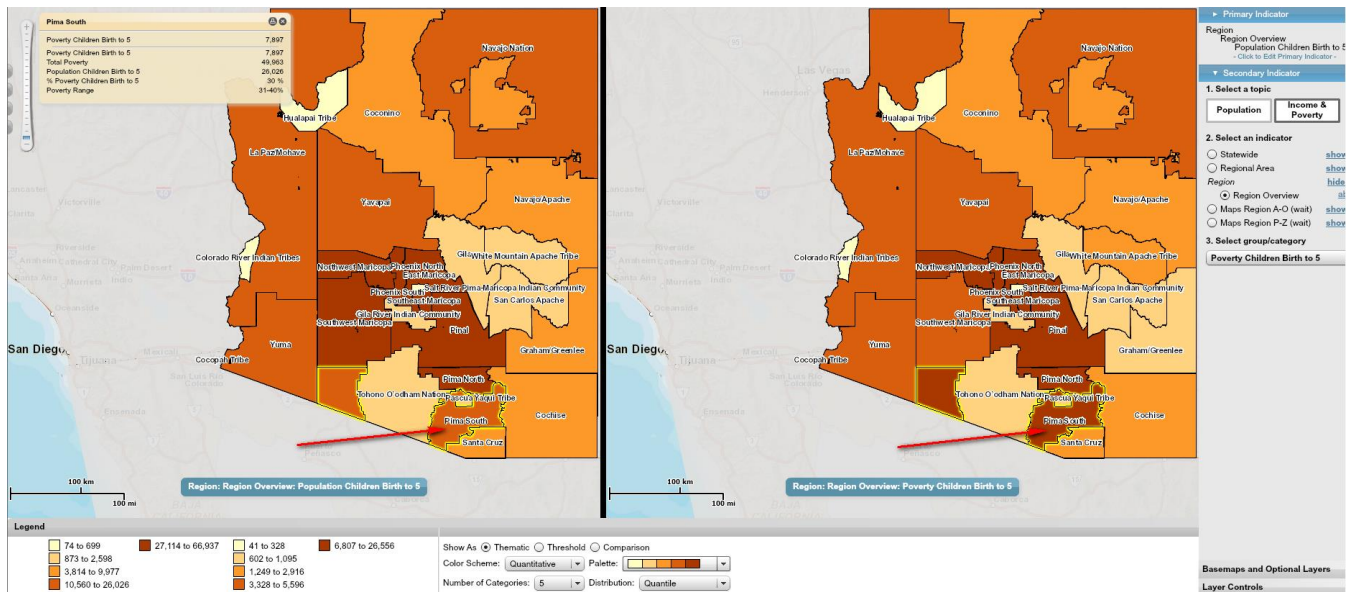


Paired Map View

The **Paired Map View** gives a side-by-side view of two indicators, regardless of geography (this map compares region level data), with **visual binding** between each map (mouse movement on one map produces visual cues on the second).

The **Legend** displays the distribution breakdown for each map – left corresponding to left map and right corresponding to right map.

Note: pay particular attention to the **Distribution** selections. The options available are **Quantile**, **Equal Interval**, and **Natural Breaks** (Quantile is the default). To ensure the most accurate representation, make sure both maps are distributed the same way.

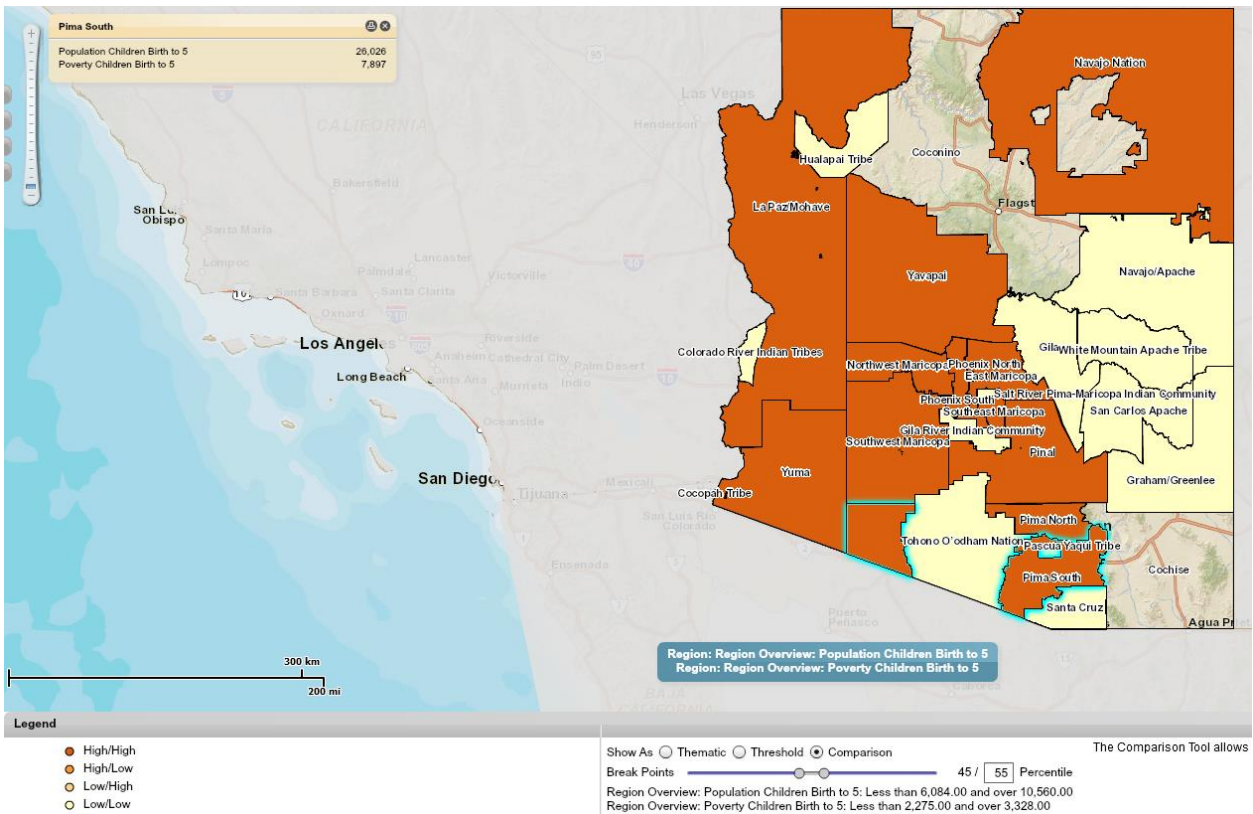


Comparison

Comparison



To formally overlap a primary and secondary indicator, ensure the two maps are using the same geographic boundaries (region to region, census block to census block, etc.), are utilizing the same **Distribution** (Quantile or Equal Interval), and click the **Comparison** radio button.



Note: the **Legend** changes when viewing as a Comparison. Select a unique **Break Point** by clicking and dragging the button on the Break Point line.

Removing Secondary Indicator

To remove the Secondary Indicator or Comparison, click on the minus (-) sign to close.
